- Planning the transition of REACH services into the Low Incidence framework
- Development of Calgary and Area RCSD's Communication Plan
- Establishment of monthly eNewsletter as key communication tool

Year 2 2014 - 2015

- Parent Representatives included on the Regional Leadership Team
- Complex Communication Needs project and crossregional Working Group

2016 - 2017

- Revision of Evaluation Framework to 3 year cycles
