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EXEMPLARY PRACTICE: COOPERS CROSSING SCHOOL — GROWING LITERACY THROUGH MORNING MESSAGE

Teacher: Ashley Burndred

At Cooper's Crossing School, teacher Ashley Burndred has been using morning messages to help her Grade 1 students develop their literacy skills. Each morning, every student is provided with an individual bag containing sounds and sight words tailored to the students' needs. The class than gathers to read through a morning message. During this time, they use various strategies to decode missing or tricky words, identify spelling rules and practice sight words.

Reading morning messages together is highly collaborative, as students work together using the reading strategies, they are each working on to uncover the missing pieces of the message. Reading together in this way makes literacy meaningful and personalized to every student in the classroom. This teaching practice directly achieves goals and outcomes of RVS' Education plan by advancing students' literacy skills while engaging them in meaningful and relevant learning

Congratulatory letter to Minister of Infrastructure, Martin Long, sent Mar. 10:

The Board of Trustees for Rocky View Schools (RVS) offers its congratulations on your appointment as Minister of Infrastructure. We appreciate your service and commitment to your community and to Alberta.

We look forward to working with you to ensure RVS' current and future students have the spaces they need in which to learn and achieve.

The Board welcomes an opportunity to meet with you at your earliest convenience to discuss our infrastructure and maintenance needs, as well as offer insight, suggestions and potential solutions for getting schools designed, built and open for learning as quickly as possible.

Response letter from the Minister of Education regarding the Board's feedback on Charter School applications and Chestermere accommodation, received Mar. 13:

Thank you for your letters on behalf of Rocky View Schools. I appreciate you reaching out to share your concerns about the process for approving public charter schools, as well as capacity in Chestermere while the division waits for new schools to be built in the community.

I value Rocky View Schools as an integral partner for Education in Southern Alberta, and I have asked the department to carefully consider your suggestions regarding the notification process.

Alberta Education carefully evaluates all capital plan submissions from school jurisdictions to prepare recommendations for government consideration. Each project is assessed using criteria such as health and safety, enrolment growth, building condition, functionality, programming needs, and legal obligations. We appreciate the board's continued advocacy for students and the community of Chestermere.

Advocacy letter to Minister of Education and MLAs Chantelle de Jonge, Nathan Cooper, Angela Pitt, Pete Guthrie and Sarah Elmeligi, sent Mar. 19:

RVS appreciates the government's continued investment in K-12 education in Budget 2025 to address some of the pressures being felt across the system.

The adjusted funding formula – which still includes the previous year's enrolment numbers – will help address the challenges created when some students are not funded by government; however, this does not go far enough. The Board believes education funding must be rooted in the principle of every student being fully funded every year and our advocacy for a more equitable funding model for Kindergarten to Grade 12 students will continue.

We appreciate the government's recognition of our need for new schools and modular classrooms to mitigate the very real impacts of rapidly



growing enrolment in many of our communities. RVS is playing catch up after many years receiving no new school funding and the Board will continue to advocate for a steady stream of capital project approvals to alleviate future space pressures on our students and staff.

On Mar. 18, Chair Gilbert attended the 2025 RVATA Local 35 Teacher Induction Ceremony and shared a congratulatory message on behalf of the Board to the over 70 new teachers who were being officially welcomed into the teaching profession here in Rocky View Schools. The standing room only event was alive with the excitement and passion of RVS' new teachers, supported by their administrators, and the Board wishes them all the best for a successful year, and a long and fulfilling career!
